

MEETING MINUTES
PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING
JUNE 1, 2020
GERMANTOWN VILLAGE HALL BOARD ROOM

CALL: The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Chairman Miller.

ROLL CALL: Chairman Miller, Trustee Myers, Trustee Pieper, and Trustee Wing.

Also present were Police Chief Snow, Fire Chief Delain, Clerk Braunschweig, Village Administrator Kreklow.

PUBLIC COMMENT: no discussion

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: a motion was made by Myers, seconded by Pieper, to approve the minutes of the May 4, 2020 Public Safety Committee meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

POLICE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Snow reported on the following:

- Demonstrations of unrest may be moving to the suburb areas, the police department has increased staffing when needed until these events cease, they are also coordinating with area agencies to assist if needed
- The second K9 Unit is working 3rd shift, there have already been arrests made due to the work of the new K9 Unit
- The police department lobby has been reopened
- There have been cancellations of some summer events due to coronavirus precautions (NAC Night, Youth Academy)
- Wing questioned lower numbers for traffic stops, Snow advised the department had been limiting their contact with the public when possible and traffic had been lighter during the last couple months, it is now picking up and traffic stops will be conducted as normal

FIRE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT: Delain reported on the following:

- The fire department lobby has reopened
- They are not holding any public education sessions for now
- Trying to keep their interaction with the public at a minimum now due to their contact with positive coronavirus patients
- A decision has not yet been made on whether to hold the Fire Safety Fair in October
- Fire inspections will resume on July 1st
- Myers asked for updated information on positive coronavirus cases in Village, Delain advised there were 16 new cases and no deaths in the last 2 weeks
- Pieper asked about locations for positive cases, Delain advised they only receive information on residents of the Village and the locations are scattered throughout the Village

OVERTIME REPORTS:

Police Department – Snow advised the overtime numbers are tracking well so far, training has been limited and not much vacation used so far, he anticipates the numbers will increase with overtime associated with the protests

Fire Department – Delain advised the report should show a downturn in numbers, the vacancy created by a retirement has been filled and staffing is good, there will be overtime to cover vacations

NEW BUSINESS

LIQUOR LICENSE RELATED FEE: Miller advised this item was placed on the agenda for the American Legion who had requested a waiver for the fee since they have been closed and had no revenue. The liquor license fee was paid by an anonymous citizen which made it unnecessary to discuss waiver options. Miller thanked the anonymous donor for their generosity.

OPERATOR LICENSE DENIALS:

Ramone V. Parker – applicant was not present. Snow advised the application was denied by the police department due to Parker’s status as a convicted felon and history of drug arrests. Discussion followed with Wing noting that the arrests were from 2012 and he was not in favor of denying a person the opportunity to make a living. He also advised that many establishments have up-to-date surveillance systems which monitor staff and customers.

A motion was made by Wing, seconded by Pieper, to forward this application to Village Board with a recommendation of approval. Motion carried unanimously.

Brian K. Simmons – applicant was not present. Snow advised the application was denied by the police department due to Simmons conviction on a misdemeanor charge of Battery with a condition of his probation that it would be unlawful for him to be in possession of any alcohol.

A motion was made by Wing, seconded by Miller, to forward this application to Village Board with a recommendation of approval. Motion failed 1-3 with Wing voting aye. Miller, Myers, Pieper voted nay.

DISCUSSION OF SPEED LIMIT ON PARK AVENUE: Miller advised he had received emails from Park Avenue residents who had concerns with truck traffic from Gehl's and speeding vehicles. He noted that the truck traffic issue was resolved with Director of Public Works and Gehl's. Miller added that he has received additional calls regarding speeding concerns but nothing further about truck traffic.

Discussion followed with Pieper advising she was monitoring the traffic on Park and did observe a truck. Snow stated that speeding complaints on Park have been received in the past, there are some problems with limited space on that street for traffic posts with squads. He added that extra patrols could be done and the speed board could be set up in the area to monitor the speeds and he could bring those numbers back to the committee. Zabel mentioned that engineering could look into using a speed bridge similar to what was done at Saxony.

Wing brought up concerns with Gehl's as they had used Park Avenue for a truck hauling a silo after being told not to by the Village. He said he felt that laws should be enforced equally and he did not feel that was being done now. Wing also asked if signage similar to the speed signs used on Freistadt could be considered for Park Ave., or even if those signs could be moved to Park.

Kreklow advised he would talk to Public Works regarding signage and speed bumps, adding that Engineering is looking into the configuration of Hwy 145 in an effort to slow traffic, there may be other options to look into.

Miller stated this item would be brought back to next month's meeting with additional information from Snow and Kreklow.

NEXT MEETING: A Special Public Safety Meeting to be held on Monday, June 15, 2020 prior to the Village Board meeting at 7:00 p.m. at Village Hall Boardroom.

Next regular meeting will be on Monday, July 6, 2020 at 6:00 p.m.
